To inform the tenants of Rock Island Arsenal of the impending flood and provide a timely and comprehensive flood status update.

In preparation for the forecasted flood, crews will begin erecting a flood wall on top of the north levee from Gillespie Street to the east end of the Island.

As this operation begins, this area will be designated as a restricted area, barricaded, and only be used by security and personnel working the flood situation.

We appreciate everyone respecting the designated restricted area and not walking, jogging, or driving in these areas. As the river level rises, additional areas will become restricted.

SITREP a/o 4 Apr 11

As of now the flood forecast through Apr 11th shows the river starting to level off at or around the moderate flood level of 16.2'. This doesn't mean we are in the clear, just means the weather conditions have been favorable. Increased flooding and risk would be caused by rapidly increased snow melt up north and precipitation up north or in the QCA over the next few weeks. Preparedness/Mitigation updates are as follows:


1. Current flood prediction for the next week do not warrant any further Hesco installations at this time.
2. Suspended bulk sand delivery due to wet conditions. Expect to continue later this week. About 100 loads still required.
3. Contractor will repair damaged grassed area by the sundial as soon as weather/soil conditions permit.
4. Continuing to monitor flood predictions.






RFIs

1. Should the flood waters reach such a level to constrain (but not totally prohibit) traffic onto RIA and tenant mission performance; how will the guard force implement further access control limits to only allow entrance of those authorized by each tenant for high priority MEFs?
 - As of now we currently don't have MEF rosters built into the RCx (the vetting system used for access control). We have the capability to build rosters into the system but it becomes a matter of maintaining rosters and pushing updates to the DES for the RCx system. This is an issue that will require further analysis from COOP planners on the installation and the DPTMS & DES.
