Safe Drinking Water Disinfection Byproduct NOV



Notice of Violation (NOV) for Safe Drinking Water?

Testing results we received on 21 November 2014 show that our system exceeds the standards of Safe Drinking Water Disinfectant and Disinfection Byproduct Rule Stage 2.

The quarterly samples for HAA5 (a sum of 5 Haloacetic acids) were above the regulated MCL for the annual average. At one of two sampling locations on RIA was at 0.066mg/L.

What's been done to solve this?

- 1) Public Health Command has been engaged to assist.
- 2) Additional samples have been taken at Water Plant and in the Distribution system to better understand the current situation.
- 3) A flowing "shunt" has been established to reduce water stagnation near BLDG340.

Is the Water Safe to drink?

Per the EPA: "You do not need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor."

What else might need to be done?

Things still in consideration:

- **Distribution Maintenance**
Flushing, Month of Free Chlorine Water Plant Operation, New Pipe (non-iron)
- **Water Tank Management**
Insure "High turnover rate" for tank or install mechanical means to mix
- **WTP Changes**
Premix chlorine and ammonia (under permit of IL-EPA), Enhanced Coagulation "polishing" during summer

When will the NOV be "lifted"?

Samples are taken quarterly, so it will may be two or three quarters of samples before the average comes back below the required MCL

Winter Weather Preventing Slips, Trips and Falls

Prevention

- Plan ahead; Be aware of the weather forecast
- Be aware of the “Thaw – Freeze – Thaw – Freeze” cycle and time of day (e.g. dark mornings and afternoons)
- Wear proper footwear
- Take smaller steps when walking; flat footed and/or shuffle
- Anticipate ice under snow
- Walk slowly and never run on icy ground; avoid rapid changes in direction
- Keep both hands free for balance rather than in your pockets
- Walk in designated walkways; walk along grassy edge of walkway if walkway not clear
- Avoid carrying loads, especially those that block your vision
- Keep your eyes on where you are going
- Expect “black ice” when the pavement looks wet
- Test potentially slick areas by tapping your foot on them
- Step – don’t jump – from vehicles or equipment

Don't Take Chances!

- Sit – then swing – into vehicles after clearing off shoes
- Avoid leaning into vehicles – place items in trunk/hatchback areas
- Keep walkways/stairs clear of debris, water, ice and slippery materials; use handrails from start to finish
- Use telescoping window scraper rather than stretching/reaching across
- When entering buildings remove snow and water from footwear to prevent wet, slippery conditions indoors.
- Be aware that parking lots (areas between parked cars) may be slick
- ** Call the work order desk to report slippery areas or areas needing attention

When given no choice but to walk on ice...

- Take short steps or shuffle for stability
- Bend slightly, walk flat-footed with your center of gravity directly over the feet
- Be prepared to fall
 - If you fall – Fall with sequential contacts at your thigh, hip and shoulder to avoid using your arms to protect against breakage
 - Roll with the fall – Try to twist and roll backwards rather than falling forward
 - Relax as much as possible when you begin to fall
 - Bend your back and head forward so you won't slam your head on the pavement as your feet shoot out from under you.
- Toss the load – Protect yourself instead of the objects being carried

Moline's Redevelopment Strategy

- In the late 1980's, Moline was rebounding from an agricultural depression that severely impacted the Quad Cities costing more than 23,000 jobs.
- A group of 12 dedicated business and civic leaders formed coalition to collaborate with the City of Moline to "renew" Moline. The task of this public/private partnership was to create jobs, expand Moline's tax base, and return the vibrancy to Moline's downtown.




